What To Do When . . .

There is a reason that we need a Savior. Life is hard. No, not just hard, it is impossibly difficult. To win at life is more than any of us can accomplish. We need God to save us, so that we can actually finish as a winner instead of a loser. And God wants us to win; this is what it means when we say that God wants to bless us. He wants us to receive the prize for which he has created us and called us.

But proclaiming our faith in Jesus as our Savior and Lord is not a quick fix to our problems; many times it makes life feel harder rather than easier. We walk by faith, not sight; we are called to pick up our crosses; we can expect trouble; the world is going to hate us—these are all biblical descriptions of what we can expect after Jesus becomes our savior. Yet, despite all this, life with Christ is the promise of a better life, but the better life isn't simply what happens after we die.



God wants to shower blessings on us, starting now.

We have reason to hope and even expect that Jesus is going to help our lives be filled with greater joy, and peace and love. But this all comes to us in surprising and unexpected ways. Christians have described it as God's

severe mercy. Because he wants the best for us, we sometimes experience the worst so we can get to the best. Salvation in Christ is more like physical therapy than simply taking a pill. It doesn't always feel good, but He is working to restore us to full health.

And following this analogy, the Bible becomes for us the primary repository of God's wisdom in helping us in the recovery process. As we head into summer, we are going to be turning to the Scriptures for direction in knowing

WHAT TO DO WHEN ... we face some of the impossible difficulties in life (see full sermon series information on page 5).

One of the dangers in a series like this is to over-simplify the problems and reduce the biblical witness into neat and tidy solutions. I truly believe God gives us great wisdom in Scripture to help us through the darkest of days. But it doesn't mean it's going to be easy. There is a mystery to the evil and suffering we endure for which the Bible does explain. Instead, God gives us reasons for hope, which means there is also room for doubt and fear.

It is my hope that in the coming weeks we might touch on situations or issues that have become a road block or stumbling block in your life, and that by God's grace we might begin the journey of finding our way through them.

Youth Deputation 2011

West Side's 2011 Deputation Trip is planning to join the inner-city ministry of Urban Promise in Camden, NJ in July 2011. This ministry started in 1988 as a spin-off of an education ministry founded by Dr. Tony Campolo. The mission of Urban Promise is to equip children and teens with the skills necessary for academic achievement, life management, spiritual growth and leadership rooted in the principles of Christian faith. This is accomplished through after-school programs, summer



camp, alternative schools, job training initiatives and a host of other programs that challenge youth to develop their academic, social, creative, spiritual and leadership potential. Unique to the vision of Urban Promise is a commitment to involving local teenagers (Street Leaders) in the tutoring, mentoring, and coaching of younger children in the community. By involving teens in the leadership process, Urban Promise is creating a new generation of young, visionary leaders who embody a commitment to change their own community.

The Youth Deputation team for this summer has been formed and is meeting to prepare for the trip. Our Mission Statement is: "Glorify God, Give Generously, and Grow in Grace." The Deputation Trip will contain three elements:

- Mornings will be spent working with children in the Summer Camp program. Activities include spiritual development, arts and crafts, sports, or special events.
- Afternoons will be spent in various projects ranging from light building repairs, maintenance, cleaning, and outside grounds upkeep. This is a crucial money-saving tool, allowing Urban Promise to direct more resources to the children.
- Highlights will include learning the history of the city, its people, and some of the unique aspects of this community. The Urban Promise staff and leadership will lead discussions and lectures on various issues and allow workgroup guests to engage in meaningful reflection on social and political issues facing urban communities. This is done in an effort to break down stereotypes and create meaningful dialogue between local residents and visiting teams.
- We are also planning to attend an event at which Tony Campolo is scheduled to speak on Sun., Jul. 17.

You can support the Deputation Team as prayer partners, sponsors, and financially. We are working toward reinstating a sponsor aspect to Deputation to allow a team member to share experiences with a congregation member. All the new titles are on display in the library, located in Room 2-4 in West Side North - around the



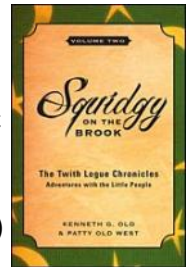
